### May Newsletter



Here, at Faith Lutheran we are experiencing new life, as our congregation is rekindling our ministry after a period of crises of various kinds. We continue to experience change (and always will), but it is life affirming change. The council continues to work on developing policies and procedures to govern the congregation and keep everyone together. We are working to eradicate a culture of secrets that have led to divisions. We are considering our mission in the world. We are planning for ways to incorporate our young people into the ministry of the church in meaningful and effective ways. These are good things and get folks involved, but are essentially fund raisers rather than mission. We are looking for other ways to serve outside our congregation and to involve folks in mission and ministry. And in worship, we are experimenting with some changes to wake us up and make it interesting (and even...fun!) to worship our amazing God!

Not everyone will like every new thing...and that's OK. Remember that we're in the business of Holy Experiments, and if something doesn't work or isn't a good fit, that just gives us data and we can move on! ### IMPORTANT NEWS FROM ERNIE HALLER, ONE OF OUR FABULOUS IT PERSONS

Phishing is a form of email SPAM aimed at enticing potential victims to provide login credentials and other information that can be exploited for either financial gain or access to valuable data and resources.

Spear phishing targets particular individuals or groups, such as members of a particular organization, to trick them into providing credentials.

Spear phishing can appear to come from phone numbers of email addresses that may look similar to people that you may know but are slightly different.

Sometimes spear phishing campaigns look to make some money. They usually ask for gift cards because gift cards are hard to track and easy to use.

Pastor Peggy does not ask members for gift cards or other financial help – especially via text message or Email.

Popcorn PDWER

### What you need:

- 2 Tbsp. popcorn kernels
- · 2 tsp. oil
- 1 Tbsp. sugar
- Brown paper lunch bag

### What you do:

- Add popcorn kernels, oil and sugar to the bag.
- 2. Fold the bag's top down about half an inch. Repeat two more times. Gently shake to mix ingredients.
- 3. Microwave for 1½ or 2 minutes (or use the Popcorn setting). Allow bag to cool before removing and opening it.
- 4. As you share popcorn with family and friends, discuss the change in the kernels. Read Acts 2 together. What changes did the disciples experience? What was the source of their power?



### **RECIPES**

### SAINT PETER'S CHURCH GLUTEN FREE BREAD RECIPE (Sue Stahler)

#### **INGREDIENTS**

2 cups coarsely ground (purchased or use food processor) gluten free oats

2 cups gluten free baking mix

1 tablespoon double acting baking powder

2 teaspoons xanthan gum

1/4 teaspoon salt

3/4 cup non-eucalyptus honey

1/2 cup carbonated water

1/2 cup soy mile

1/4 cup vegetable oak

Optional: orange zest

(or 1 cup gluten free oats and 3 cups gluten free baking mix)

### **DIRECTIONS**

Preheat oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit

Sift baking mix, baking powder, xanthan gum and salt together in a large bowl. Adde oats and stir until you have a coarse mix.

In a second bowl whisk together (make a slurry) the honey, soy milk, and carbonated water. Then stir in a generous 1/4 cups of vegetable oil. All liquid to dry ingredients as need to make a large dough round. (This will be a sticky, wet dough. It is easier to work with if covered and refrigerated for one hour.

But dough ball in half. Turn dough out on a surface generously dusted with gluten free baking mix and roll to about 1/4 inch thickness. It's better to liberally dust with baking mix right before rolling out dough. Cut into six-inch circles using a lid or an inverted bowl. Score into squares by pressing a serrated knife lightly (not dragging) into the bread to facilitate breaking during distribution. Place breads on parchment lined baking sheet. Re-form scraps and repeat. Bake at 400 degree F for approximately 10-12 minutes until lightly browned. Cooking time will vary depending on moisture level— do not over bake. Cool on cooling rack

Yields about 6 loaves
